



Bibliographic data

- Any patent office will ask you for bib data
 - Inventor names
 - Applicant name
 - Title
 - Priority claims
 - Suggested figure for publication
 - Where to send correspondence


Bibliographic data


- USPTO also asks for:
 - Application type (utility, design, plant)
 - Provisional, non-provisional
 - Inventor mailing address
 - Inventor residence (city, state or country)
 - Indication of small entity
 - Domestic benefit information
 - Assignee information


Bibliographic data

- PCT system also asks for:
 - Email address for correspondence
 - Inventor mailing address
 - Applicant domicile and citizenship
 - Selection of International Searching Authority






Why we like dragging and dropping from an ePCT Address Book

- Do we like it because it is easier than hand-keying?
- Do we like it because it is easier than copying and pasting?
- The real reason we like it is that if it was correct in the ePCT Address Book, then it preserves its correctness when we drag and drop it into the PCT Request
- Note that we can also drag and drop from an ePCT Address Book into a Demand for Preliminary Exam
- Note that we can also drag and drop from an ePCT Address Book into a 92*bis* Request




Why we like dragging and dropping from an ePCT Address Book


- With hand-keying, we might make mistakes
- With copying and pasting, we might leave a field blank or paste into an incorrect field
- If we drag and drop from an ePCT Address Book into the PCT Request, or into a Demand for Preliminary Exam or into a 92bis Request, it won't get information into an incorrect field or leave a field blank













Collaborative workflow

- A first person might start a task, completing some fields
- A second person might continue the task, completing additional fields
- A third person might review and click "submit"
- These people can be paralegals or assistants or attorneys or agents
- Some of the people might be client people
- One of the helpers might be an outside contract paralegal or service provider


Sharing with clients


- Inventors can see the draft filing package taking shape
- They can check inventor lists
- They can check the sequence of the named inventors
- They can see priority claims
- They can see the specification, claims, abstract and drawings
- When it gets filed, they can see the application number
- They can receive notifications of events and later documents



- A corporate patent department can share with outside counsel
- This might be multiple outside counsels
- This might be foreign agents
